Every year Christ Church raises grant money during Lent and Easter to

HHR's offices are located on the Christ Church property, and we have partnered with them in the past for refugee resettlement and in-kind donations. HHR provides assistance to hundreds of immigrants and refugees in Westchester Country and neighboring counties. With your financial assistance, we can help HHR staff by addressing their clients' needs for housing support, employment, education, language tutoring, transportation needs, mental health, and financial planning assistance. Your donation will help underwrite the federal government's recent closures to areas of funding that help those already in this country who are striving for permanent legal residency and citizenship. It's what you do to help those in need that matters most. Our 2025 Outreach Appeal for Lent & Easter continues throughout Lent and Eastertide until Pentecost, June 8.

Lent, Holy Week & Easter

Lenten Quiet Day: Reflections on the Passion in Matthew, Mark,



Saturday, April 5 from 9am to 4pm. A Quiet Day is a day of silence and reflection. On this day Father Matt will offer four reflections, one on each of the Passion Narratives found in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark,

Luke, and John. The cost of the Quiet Day is \$20 and covers the cost of breakfast and lunch.

The Sunday of the Passion: Palm Sunday is April 13

The Holy Eucharist with Blessing of Palms and the Passion According to Saint Luke will be celebrated at 8am and 10am. The 10am will include an outdoor procession. Roles for the 10am Passion will be taken by our Confirmation Class, Youth Group, and Sunday School.

Maundy Thursday Mediterranean Feast: April 17, 5:30pm



Maundy Thursday Agape Mediterranean Feast (catered) will feature lamb and chicken kabobs, humus, stuffed grape leaves, Greek and lentil salads, and many other Middle Eastern dishes. The Choir is encouraged to come at 5:30 so they can eat before

rehearsal. Maundy Thursday Mass begins at 7:30pm. \$25 per adult, children and teens eat free. Please RSVP with the QR Code.

Maundy Thursday Liturgy of the Lord's Supper: April 17, 7:30pm

Maundy Thursday is the first of the great liturgies of the Easter Triduum. On Maundy Thursday, a number of ancient rites are observed during the Celebration of the Lord's Supper, including the washing of feet. Bread and wine are consecrated for the ministration of Holy Communion, both for Maundy Thursday and for the Good Friday Liturgy. At the end of the service, the Eucharist is reposed at the Bolton Altar, the High Altar is washed with wine and water, the sanctuary is stripped of all ornament and furnishing, and the cross is veiled.

Good Friday Liturgy of the Lord's Passion: April 18, 12:00pm

On Good Friday, we celebrate the second of the great liturgies of the Easter Triduum, the Celebration of the Passion of the Lord. Following the Liturgy of the Word and the Passion Narrative from Saint John, the Church offers its prayers in a form used by the ancient Church, a form now used only on Good Friday. Then at the Showing of the Cross we are invited to kneel or sit for a period of reflection and prayer. Finally we receive Holy Communion from the Sacrament consecrated at the Celebration of the Lord's Supper.

Holy Saturday Office & Blessing of the Garden: April 19, 10:00am Join us for the Holy Saturday Office which includes several prayers, the reading of Jesus' Burial in the Tomb, and the Blessing of the Garden of Resurrection. This service lasts about 15 minutes.

The Great Vigil of Easter Eve: April 19, 7:30pm

The Great Vigil of Easter, celebrated on Saturday night, is the final part of the Easter Triduum. In the dark we await the light that proclaims the resurrection. Then we share that light, hear the great prophecies about Christ, renew our Baptismal vows, and celebrate the resurrection of our Lord in word, song, and at our Lord's Table. Don't miss the Easter Vigil!

Breaking the Lenten Fast on Easter Eve! April 19, 9:00pm

After the Great Vigil of Easter has concluded we gather in the Library to break our Lenten Fasts with desserts and other refreshments! Everything is potluck!

Easter Sunday is April 20, 9:00am & 11:15am

The Children's Choir will sing at the 9am Eucharist; other than that each Easter Mass is identical and will include members of the Modus Operandi Orchestra.

The Great Easter Egg Hunt of 2025! April 20, 10:15am - 11:00am

The Easter Bunny has been booked to visit Christ Church in 2025 and he is bringing 2,500 Easter Eggs filled with Candy!
